

Soldiers' Christmas Packages.

It is desired that a Christmas package from home be sent to every American soldier who is with the American Expeditionary Force in France. The government has made a ruling to the effect that packages of only a standard size will be received for mailing and that Nov. 15th is the last day on which any package can be mailed.

The Red Cross will furnish boxes of the standard size required by the government and will look after and attend to the packing, inspecting and wrapping and mailing of each package.

It is the purpose of the Red Cross of Chatham county to see that every Chatham soldier, white and colored alike, receive a Christmas package, and to this end it is earnestly requested that the name and address of each Chatham soldier across the seas be at once mailed to the Chairman of the Chatham County Red Cross, Pittsboro, N. C.

Families and friends of soldiers abroad will be permitted to send such gifts as they may desire but such gift or gifts can only be sent in the packages provided for by the government.

The Red Cross will be glad to have the same properly sent and will give information to any desiring it in regard to the same.
