

Fourth-Grade Field Trips to the Chatham Historical Museum and Historic Courthouse Are Underway Thanks to Generous Community Supporters



Did you know that CCHA offers the opportunity for every Chatham County fourth grader to visit the Chatham Historical Museum and the Historic Courthouse to learn about Chatham history, government, and civics? Our 7th year is now underway.

Begun in 2013 as a collaboration between CCHA volunteers and Chatham County Schools, the field trip experience dovetails the museum's content with North

Carolina's educational standards. Students rotate in small groups through the museum room, the artifacts room, the grand foyer, and the courtroom. All then assemble in the courtroom for a visit with a costumed reenactor and presentation of honorary CCHA membership certificates.

Each year, the reach of the field trips has expanded to include more schools and now serves more than 800 Chatham 4th graders. The generous support of business and community donors allows the CCHA volunteers to offer these field trips at no cost to students.
