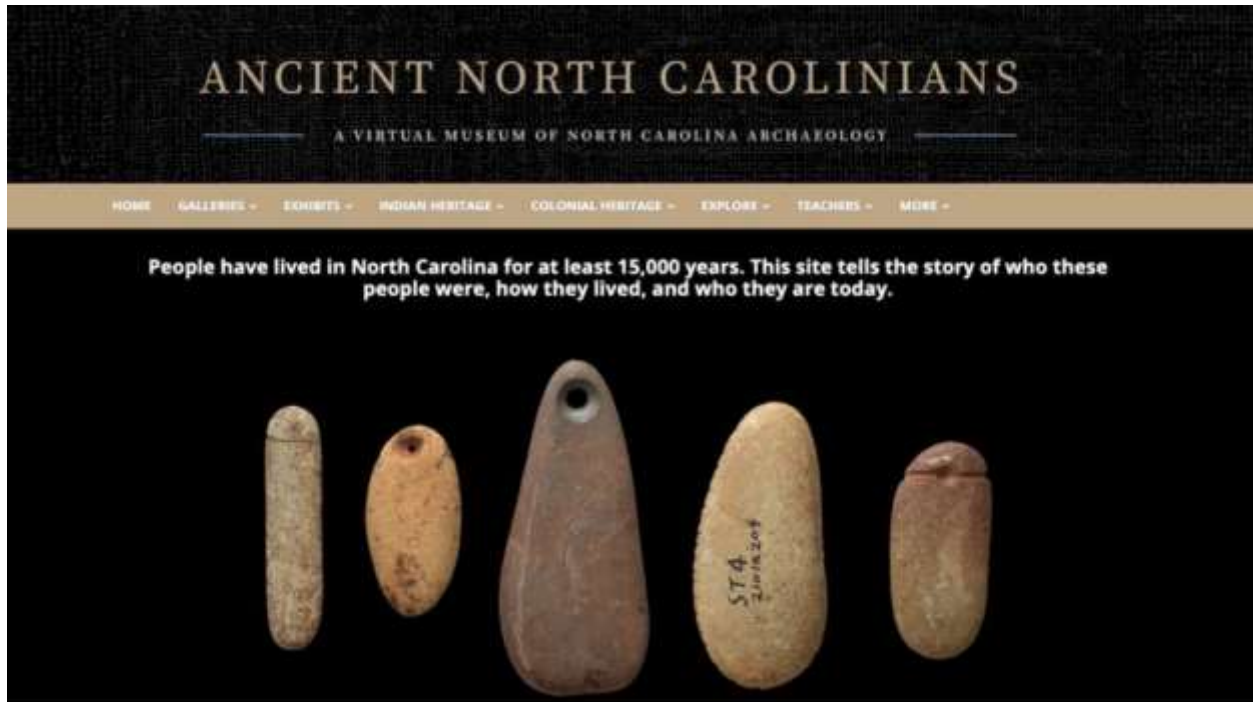


## Worth a Look: Chatham's Archaeological Heritage

Chatham County is one of many NC counties whose archaeological resources are exhibited on a new website, [AncientNC](#), created by the Research Laboratories of Archaeology at UNC-Chapel Hill. The website brings exhibits on North Carolina archaeology and the ancient history of the state's American Indian peoples to anyone with access to a web browser. This history is especially relevant to North Carolina, home to 80,000 American Indians, the largest population east of the Mississippi River.



On the AncientNC website, visitors can search topics throughout North Carolina pre-colonial and colonial history. They can view 3D images of bones, pottery shards, arrowheads and other artifacts in the Research Laboratories of Archaeology collection. With the click of a mouse, they can turn the image 360 degrees and zoom in to see, for example, the details of an American Indian spearhead from 1000 B.C.
