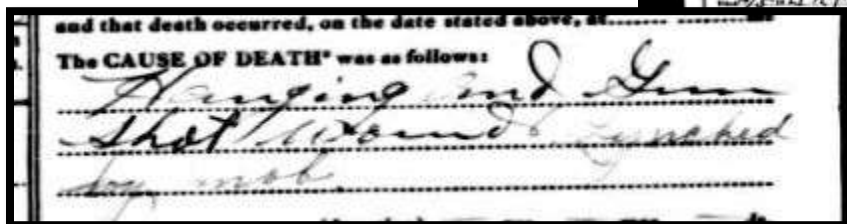


Chatham County Lynchings Documented

The Equal Justice Initiative's (EJI) Community Remembrance Project is part of a national campaign to recognize the victims of lynching and to acknowledge the horrors of racial injustice. EJI has issued a report on the history of these lynchings and has compiled a list of lynchings in each state by county. Chatham County is one of three counties in North Carolina for which six lynchings have been documented.
